Letter from the Co-Pastors

Dearly Beloved,

If you have gone to our new website, www.fpcpottstown.org, you may recognize these words from our "Worship" page:

Q: "What is the chief purpose of human life?"

A: "To glorify God, and enjoy God forever."

At the center of a fulfilled and fulfilling life, is the worship of God, the Trinity of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Worship is at the center of a our life as a congregation, as we seek to "glorify God and enjoy God forever." But as members of the new Worship and the Arts team discovered when doing their 'assigned readings' in preparation for this new ministry, many of us are unaware of the theology behind what we do in worship each Sunday morning. It might be helpful for many of us if we share a couple thoughts that have come out of those readings.

First of all, 'why' do we worship? An answer to this question could take up the whole newsletter, but perhaps this short story will give us some food for thought: "An elderly woman, having lost her hearing and most of her sight, continued to request a ride to church every Sunday morning. A friend asked her why she bothered, since she could not hear the sermon, the prayers, or the music. She replied, 'I go to show whose side I'm on.' Sometimes it is as simple as that. In a society that is home to people of both no faith and faith in every sort of deity, we stand to be counted, at least once a week, among the congregation of Jesus Christ." We want to show that we are on the side of God who is on our side.

Once we have found our way into the sanctuary of the Lord, we join in a service that has a particular order, a 'four-fold' order:

1. the gathering of God's people
2. the hearing of God's Word
3. the response of God's people with thanksgiving
4. the sending the people out into the world with a blessing.

This order is gospel-shaped, that is, its movement echoes the structure of the four gospels: just as Jesus first gathered his community of disciples, so we are gathered by the Holy Spirit into God's beloved community; as Jesus taught and preached and showed the Word of God, so do we hear the Word in readings, scripture, and music; as Jesus' disciples responded with thanksgiving in words and deeds of faith, so do we give respond with thanksgiving with a creed, our prayers, our offerings, and coming to the Table; as Jesus sent his disciples into the world to be light and salt, so we are sent into the world to be a blessing.

Every Sunday, in the Young Children and Worship room, our youngest worshippers prepare to worship by hearing the following words: "This is a special place. It is a special place because God is here. And in this place we have all the time we need. We can walk more slowly and talk more softly because **(cont., p.2)**

(Co-pastors Letter cont.) ...someone might be talking with God, and we don't want to disturb them. This is a special place, a place to talk with God, to listen to God, and to hear the stories of God. We need a way to get ready to be in such a special place with God. You can get ready all by yourself. You don't need me to tell you to get ready. Quietness comes from inside you, not from someone telling you to be quiet. *Let's listen for the quiet.*"

As our children are learning to worship God in deeper ways, so may we learn from them — and model for them — to ever more fully “glorify God and enjoy God forever.”

At its September meeting, the Session:

- Retroactively approved the celebration of the Lord's supper on the Senior Seekers Work-camp this past July.
- Approved Carter taking continuing education leave, October 7-10.
- Approved inviting Dr. Bruce Main, Executive Director of Urban Promise Ministries to speak to Sunday School classes and in worship on Sunday, October 11.
- Received the monthly treasurers' report and approved transferring \$9166 to the Mission fund for expenditure by the Mission Committee..
- As part of a visioning process, listed and reflected upon "accomplishments and blessings" in our ministry in the past year, as well as "opportunities and challenges and opportunities for strengthening and growing our ministry."
- Elected Rob Wade to serve as the second elder on the Nominating Committee.
- Approved the slate of teachers and advisors commissioned in worship on September 13.
- Received an update from the Administrative Committee about efforts to repair and move the air handlers for the HVAC system in the CE wing. The air handlers are presently in the un-insulated attic which causes problems in the winter. Amy Shutt is assisting the Committee. The Administrative Committee approved repairs for a new circuit board for one of the units, but all four units in the CE wing will eventually have to be replaced. The Administrative Committee will also replace the doors leading from the utility room and kitchen into the play-yard.

- Approved receipt of the Peacemaking Offering on October 4.
- Heard an update on the Martha Porter trust and approved the attorney fees' bill which is to be paid when the church receives funds from the trust.
- Received a report from the Christian Education Committee about Rally Day and Vacation Bible School (which had a record turnout of 70 children).
- Approved a formation of a taskforce to review our current child abuse prevention policy and other related child and youth safety issues. Members of the taskforce are to be Michelle Thompson, Donna Hutchison, John Macdonald, Holly Lee, Kay Vogt, David Kyler, Bob Farra, Liv, Carter, and Kerry.
- Elected Gina James and Ginny Bleyer to be commissioners to Presbytery..
- Received reports from the co-pastors, Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministry, Endowment, Personnel, Hospitality, Worship, Administrative, Stewardship, Fellowship, Christian Education, and Mission Committees.

- Availability to attend monthly Session or Deacon meetings and assigned committee meetings.

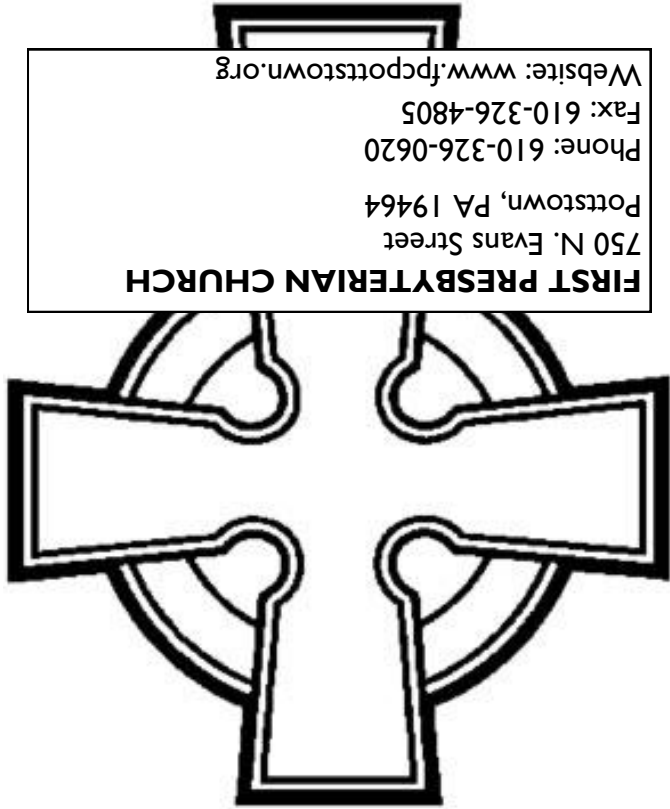
Please pass on your suggestions to the Nominating Committee using the forms available in the literature rack.
